STUDIO RAZAVI ARCHITECTURE
PARIS, FRANCE

To redesign a classical mid 19th-century apartment in central Paris for a young couple – both passionate art collectors – architect Alireza Razavi chose to ‘disrupt’ the rigidity of the existing, structurally defined layout with an expressive, irregularly shaped, landscape-like piece of architectural furniture. Constructed from fibreboard panels, this black millwork feature snakes across the entire 80 m² [861 sq ft] apartment, unifying the space

and livening it up. The structure integrates a number of functions, including a workstation for two; a media wall, shelves and cabinets; as well as the bathroom with a guest sleeping loft on top.
